- A. God believes the best in people even when we may not (Acts 9:10-16, 26-28).
- B. Loving our neighbor means believing the best in then (I Cor. 13:4-7).
- C. When we fail to believe in others, we are failing to believe in God.

EXTEND GRACE AND MERCY TO PEOPLE

- A. God is in the business of grace and mercy (Eph. 2:4-9).
- B. God doesn't extend grace and mercy because of who we are, but because of who He is (Psa. 86:5).
- C. Just as God is gracious and merciful, we ought to be gracious and merciful as well (Luke 6:36).

CELEBRATE WHEN PEOPLE CHANGE

- A. We are a culture that likes to celebrate, especially when it comes to the physical.
- B. God celebrates every time a lost person is found (Lk. 15:22-33).
- C. When a sinner repents and makes his or her life right with God, a soul has been saved from death (Jam. 5:19-20). This should cause celebration among Christians.

- B. God has gone to great depths to save those who are lost.
- C. What depths are you and I willing to go for those who are lost?
