RENOVATE: THIS YEAR I MEAN IT Week 4 – Anticipating His Arrival I Thess. 4:13-18

INTRODUCTION

- A. When was the last time you eagerly anticipated something?
- B. We anticipate those things we really look forward to taking place.
- C. Does the return of Jesus fill you with a sense of joy or cause you to feel a great sense of anxiety?

JESUS IS COMING BACK

- A. There is a time set for when the "Coming of the Lord" will take place (v. 15).
- B. The Lord Jesus Himself will descend from heaven (v. 16; Acts 1:11).
- C. Christ return is inevitable but certainly unpredictable (I Thess. 5:1-3; 2 Pet. 3:10; Matt. 24:36).

NO ONE WILL MISS HIS RETURN

- A. The Thessalonians misunderstood when Christ would return and expected it to happen during their lifetime (v. 13).
- B. Whether people are alive or already in the grave, all will be caught up to meet Him (vs. 14-17; Jn. 5:28-29).
- C. Jesus will come in a way so that every eye will see Him (Rev. 1:7).

WE HAVE HOPE

- A. We don't have to grieve the way others do (outsiders in v. 12) who have no hope (v. 13).
- B. We will be reunited with fellow believers in Christ (v 17).
- C. We will always be with the Lord (v 17).

LIVE IN ANTICIPATION OF HIS ARRIVAL

- A. Live holy and godly lives (Gal. 3:27; I Pet. 1:15-16). If our lives do not look any different than non-Christians, then our lives are not different than non-Christians.
- B. Share the Gospel with others (Matt. 28:19-20; 2 Pet. 3:9). The greatest gift we can give to others, is the gift of the Gospel.
- C. Make the important things important (Psa. 27:4; Matt. 6:33). Live every day as if it is the most important day because it could be your last day.

CONCLUSION

- A. As Christians, the return of our King should cause us to feel great joy and excitement.
- B. What if we lived every day of our lives in anticipation of His return? How might our lives look different.

C. If we aren't eagerly anticipating the Lord's return, then perhaps we're not ready for His return.
