John 13:34-35

INTRODUCTION:

- A. This past week our country celebrated Valentine's Day. This is a day we celebrate and honor those we love and cherish. It's really easy to love the people we enjoy being with.
- B. Take a good look around this room. The people we see this morning are not just people we attend worship with, they are people we are called to love.

WE ARE COMMANDED TO LOVE ONE ANOTHER

- A. Love is not optional in the life of a follower of Jesus. It is not something we get to decide if we will do or not. We are commanded to love one another (Jn. 13:34; Rom. 13:8).
- B. Jesus told the religious leaders of His day that the two greatest commandments hinged on love: love for God and love for others (Mt. 22:37-40).

LOVING OTHERS IS NOT ALWAYS EASY

- A. There are some people who are hard to love.
- B. Our love for others has nothing to do with whether a person is loveable or deserving (Mt. 5:43-48).

LOVING OTHERS IS PROOF THAT OUR HEARTS BELONG TO JESUS

- A. The church must love in order to make an impact on the world (Jn. 13:35).
- B. If we truly love God, we will love others too (I Jn. 3:10; 4:7-8; 19-21).

WAYS WE CAN BETTER LOVE ONE ANOTHER

- A. Get to know others by spending time together (Acts 2:46).
- B. Treat others the way we want to be treated (Matt. 7:12; Jam. 4:11).
- C. Be others-centered instead of self-centered (I Cor. 13:5; Phil. 2:3-4).
- D. Forgive and let things go (I Cor. 13:5; Gen. 50:15-21).

CONCLUSION:

- A. What kind of church would we be if everyone loved others exactly like you?
- B. We may not be able to make anyone else love others, but we can practice loving one another as Jesus has called us to do.
